OUTREACH CORNER

A Lifeline for Safety

In 1972, Wilhelm Hormann developed the concept of a “home alert.” His idea was to create a system of reporting health information to health care professionals spanning the distance between home and hospital. “Housnotraf” or “Emergency Alarm” was born. In the United States, Andres Dibner of Boston University developed the first alert system. The American International Telephone Company marketed the “Lifeline,” including the archetypal pendant and phone system which is still the basic form in use today.

Who doesn’t recall the iconic phrase “I’ve fallen and I can’t get up”? In 1989, this marketing tool became so popular that it could be found on tee shirts, bumper stickers and the like. Saturday Night Live used this meme for one of their most successful skits. This ad brought national attention to the growing market for life alert systems.

Today, technology has reduced the size of the transponder units and pendant as well as adding a bracelet, which may be easier to wear for some. There are many companies that offer Life Alert services. While there are inexpensive systems available, the average price for a reliable system is approximately \$30/month for a home only system. A GPS system that covers you anywhere that the service is offered for approximately \$50/month. Please note some systems will charge extra for the “fall alert” service. You need this! Other additional services you can purchase are daily check-in calls, movement monitoring and home security monitoring.

The pendant/ bracelet system is activated when a person manually presses the device button to call for help. Also, the device has an accelerometer that can actually detect a person’s movement as they fall. This will prompt the system to ask if you are “all right.” Your answer will help determine what assistance you need. If you do not respond at all, EMTs will be sent to your home.

Medicare does not cover Life Alert as they do not consider it a durable good. However, some Medicare Advantage Plans. (Part C), do offer discounts. Some Veterans Administration coverage may offer the Life Alert system used by the VA for free. AARP will cover 15% of the Lifeline system as they recommend this service. The National Council on Aging recommends this system despite being on the higher side as

it includes fall detection, is available with discount, and has a 30 day trial.

Will this device make a difference for you? Ask yourself these questions: How’s my balance, honestly? Have I fallen before? Am I frequently alone at home? Does someone check on me regularly, and if I don’t answer the phone, will they come? You don’t want to be the person who says “I’ve fallen and there’s no one coming!”

FINANCIAL AND ENERGY ASSISTANCE

MEDICARE OPEN ENROLLMENT

Open enrollment ends December 7. If you are enrolled in a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan or a Medicare Advantage Plan (HMO/PPO), it is important to understand the changes in your plan for 2024. Premiums, deductibles, co-pays, and the drugs covered by your plan can change significantly! Sign up now for a free, confidential consultation with a trained SHINE (Serving Health Insurance Needs of Everyone...on Medicare) volunteer to review any changes and make sure you’re in the right plan. Contact the COA for more info. Call soon as appointments fill up quickly!

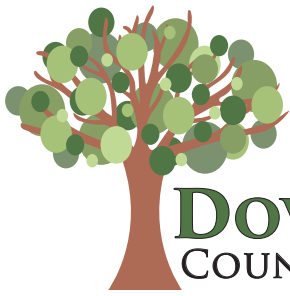
