



Functionality

- Meets present and future community needs
- Maximizes flexible use space for multi-generational programming



Experiential

- Creates exterior space for activities
- Has a welcoming atmosphere; encourages residents to meet, network, and be active



Community

- Be a focal point for town life
- Design for energy efficiency and resiliency



Sustainability

1. Wall: Existing Brick	Traditional
2. Wall: Terracotta	Contemporary
3. Wall: New Brick	Traditional
4. Roof: Zinc	Contemporary
5. Roof: Asphalt Shingles	Contemporary
6. Roof: Struct. Wd. Decking	Traditional

Compatible but Contemporary



Gym Addition

- Academy Smooth, extruded
- Compatible with 1910, yet distinct
- Modern shape, narrow flashing



Existing 1910 Building

- Goal: Match & Patch
- Waterstruck brick, heavily flashed
- Mimics Historic Kessel Brick Co.



Distinct But Compatible

- Pavilion shape marks it as special room







Traditional Materials: Contemporary Geometry

- Brick weaves together separate parts
- Canopy projects to define entry
- Texture makes wall special (east)
- Wood under canopy and soffit
