Level 3 – Critical Drought areas ban on all non-essential outdoor water use

Due to the current drought conditions, the Dover Board of Selectmen on August 18, 2022, voted to ban all nonessential water use throughout Town. Nonessential water use includes:

- irrigation of lawns, gardens, flowers and ornamental plants by means of sprinklers, automatic irrigation systems, and hand-held hoses;
- washing of vehicles, except in a commercial car wash or as necessary for operator safety;
- washing of exterior buildings, parking lots, or sidewalks.

Water Restriction Bylaw and Enforcement Policy

At the May, 2022 Town Meeting the residents of Dover voted to adopt a Water Restriction Bylaw. The Massachusetts Attorney General has reviewed and approved the new bylaw. It is now in effect. This covers all water sources in the Town including: Aquarion, Dover Municipal Water, and private wells.

Bylaw Purpose:

- Defines applicability of bylaw - covers all Dover residents and businesses regardless of water source (well, Aquarion, other):
- Defines who can declare a drought emergency - provides for more local control:
- Defines communication methods for drought conservation and emergencies:
- Defines “non-essential” water usage during drought conditions:
- Creates an enforcement mechanism for compliance.

On August 18, 2022, the Board of Selectmen approved the Water Restriction Bylaw Enforcement Policy, which ensures that the citizens of Dover are aware of the newly-created Water Use Restrictions and assist in the reduction of water consumption during states of water conservation, drought, or water emergency.

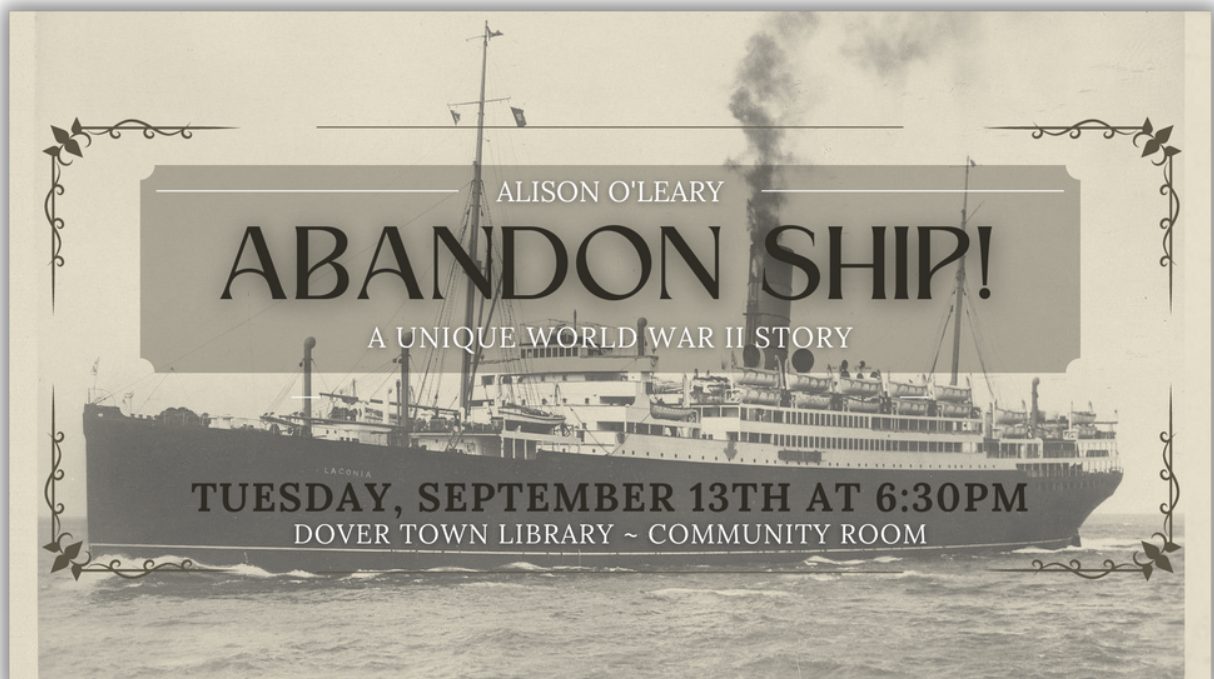

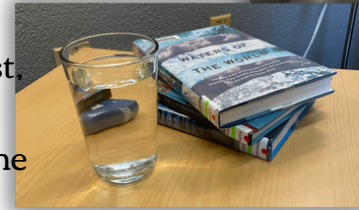

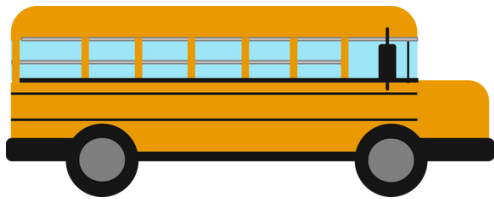

Dover Cultural Council

Apply for a Grant From the Dover Cultural Council

The Dover Cultural Council has announced this year's (2023) grant application cycle. Each year the Council looks forward to bringing new and innovative cultural programs to our community.



Forms and filing information are available September 1st online: <https://www.mass-culture.org/Dover>. When preparing your proposal, please be sure to consult Dover's town-specific "Local Guidelines" <https://www.doverma.gov/315/Dover-Cultural-Council-DCC> to make sure you are eligible. Completed proposals are due Oct. 17, 2022. Our committee will then evaluate and notify eligible recipients sometime in early winter.

The Dover Cultural Council provides grants to support a variety of artistic projects and activities that serve our community such as exhibits, festivals, short-term artist residencies or performances, workshops and lectures. Programs are to take place between January 1, 2023 and December 31, 2023. As part of a network of 329 local Cultural Councils throughout the Commonwealth, the Dover Cultural Council annually obtains funds from the Massachusetts Cultural Council, a state agency that supports community-oriented arts, humanities and science programs.

Community Center Building Committee

The Board of Selectmen hosted the Dover Community Center Building Committee in the Great Hall on August 25 for a working session to discuss a possible pathway forward for the Community Center project.

After a discussion among the participants and citizen attendees, the Board of Selectmen unanimously voted on the following:

The Board unanimously voted to charge the building committee with the following deliverables:

1. Determine the cost and timeframe to rebid the current building design.
2. Determine the cost and timeframe (including steps and associated timeframes) to determine what could be built for \$18.8M

The Building Committee anticipates a report back to the Board of Selectmen prior to the Board's September 22 meeting.
